## Minutes of the Finance Committee Williamsburg Town Offices 18 May 2016

Members Present: Paul Wetzel, Jacqueline Dufresne, Charles Dudek, Charlie Heath, Steven

David Mathers, Select Board Member and Charlene Nardi, Town Administrator were also present.

The meeting was called to order by co-chair Paul Wetzel at 6:35 p.m.

Minutes from the meeting held 11 May 2016 were reviewed. C. Dudek moved to approve the minutes as corrected; C. Heath seconded the motion. L. Rowley abstained; the remaining members voted for the motion.

- C. Heath led the Committee in reviewing the Town budget line by line. The following changes were made to the budget:
- a. In the General Government section: Computer Services line was increased from \$19,185 to 19,269 based on new knowledge of increasing rates.
- b. In the Protection on Persons & Property section: A new line entitled, "Fire Department Administrative Assistant" was created and funded at \$5,070. The funding for this line was moved from Fire Department Salaries (which was reduced to \$22,141) and Fire Department Labor which was reduced from \$28,463 to \$28,393.
- c. In the Education section: The vocational school assessment was reduced to \$191,688.
- d. In the Fixed Expenses section:

The Workers Compensation line was increased from \$22,758 to \$24,488.

The Police & Fire Disability Insurance line was increased \$1,062 to \$15,042.

The Comprehensive Insurance expense was decreased to \$63,478.

The Town FY17 proposed operating Town budget was \$6,903,363 with \$190,000 from Free Cash and \$6,713,363 from taxation. C. Heath moved to accept the corrected FY17 budget. R. Kisloski seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

It was noted that the Reserve Fund was overspent this year by \$6,778.17. The additional funding to cover the \$6,778.17 was moved from the Winter Expenses budget line. The Committee asked the Chairs to send a letter to all department heads to more carefully plan their budgets.

The Committee reviewed the Town warrant articles and voted on those articles that concerned spending money. The following decisions were made about the Town warrant.

and all loans equal to and over \$10,000 shall be approved by a vote of the Town Meeting after recommendation by the Brassworks Reuse Committee. Expenditures under \$10,000 shall be made at the discretion of the Brassworks Reuse Committee. The other authorized use of this fund will be for the purchase, lease or upgrade of any land to be used for economic development purposes within the Town of Williamsburg. Any proceeds from the resale or lease of such properties will be deposited into this fund.

THE BRASSWORKS SMALL BUSINESS LOAN TRUST FUND This Fund shall be established at the level of \$185,000. These funds shall be used for making loans to qualified small businesses per guidelines currently being used by the Brassworks Reuse Committee. These funds shall be at the discretion of the Brassworks Reuse Committee. All proceeds from the repayment of the loans made shall be deposited into this account.

and further, to terminate these trust funds and transfer the remaining monies in said accounts to the Stabilization Fund, or take any other action relative thereto.

The Town Administrator requested that the Committee make a reserve fund transfer of \$1,250.67 for the June payment to Paragus computer service. The amount of the request was expected to be a slightly high estimate. S. Romanowski moved to approve the transfer. L. Rowley seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

## The next meeting of the Finance Committee will be held on 25 May 2016 at 6:30 p.m.

There being no further business before the Committee, S. Romanowski moved to adjourn the meeting and the motion was seconded by L. Rowley. The motion passed unanimously and the meeting was adjourned at 7:50 p.m.
