Minutes of the Finance Committee Williamsburg Town Offices 17 May 2017

William Sayre, Select Board Member, Nick Dynes, member of the Greenway Committee and Charlene Nardi, Town Administrator were also present.

The meeting was called to order by co-chair Paul Wetzel at 5:10 p.m.

R. Kisloski presented the new capital plan and the Committee reviewed each line of the plan. Many questions were asked and answered about future individual requests. One proposed project, the Mill River Greenway estimated to cost \$1,173,000, was discussed by Nick Dynes. N. Dynes described the project and told the Committee that funds to offset the estimated cost of the Greenway were potentially available and will be applied for during the project. Considering all future possible outlays would increase the debt payments as a percentage of the total budget from 7.7% in FY18 to 10 to 14.5% during a period of eight years starting in FY2021. J. Dufresne moved to accept the capital plan (Article 7 on the Town meeting warrant); C. Dudek seconded the motion. P. Wetzel, C. Dudek, C. Heath, R. Kisloski, J. Dufresne voted yes; L. Rowley, Charlie Heath abstained.

The Town FY18 proposed operating Town budget was \$7,327,118 with \$218,000 from Free Cash and \$7,109,118 from taxation. The Committee did not approve these budget figures because of some uncertainty on several salary lines.

The Committee reviewed the Town warrant articles and voted on those articles that concerned spending money. The following decisions were made about the Town warrant.

purchase, eminent domain or otherwise, for conservation, open space and passive recreation purposes, certain property together with any buildings thereon, known as Horse Mountain, consisting of 34 acres, more or less, as shown on Assessors Map 8H, Parcels 9, 47 and 50, and, further, to raise and appropriate, transfer from available funds, borrow, or otherwise, the sum of \$57,820, for the purpose of acquiring said property, and the Board of Selectmen and the Conservation Commission be authorized to file on behalf of the Town of Williamsburg any and all applications deemed necessary for grants and/or reimbursements from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts deemed necessary under Chapter 132A, Section 11 (the so-called LAND grant) and/or any other applications in any way connected with the scope of this acquisition, and the Board of Selectmen and the Conservation Commission be authorized to enter into all agreements and execute any and all instruments as may be necessary on behalf of the Town of Williamsburg to effect said acquisition and apply for, accept and expend said grant funds, or take any other action relative thereto.

The motion passed unanimously

Minutes from the meeting held 10 May 2017 were reviewed. C. Dudek moved to approve the minutes as corrected; R. Kisloski seconded the motion. L. Rowley abstained; the remaining members voted for the motion.

The Town Administrator requested that the Committee make a reserve fund transfer of \$1,001.00 for Paragus computer services, including additional virus security protection. R. Kisloski moved to approve the transfer. C. Dudek seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

The Town Administrator requested that the Committee make a reserve fund transfer of \$1,200.00 to the Select Board to pay for copies of the Town newsletter. L. Rowley moved to approve the transfer. J. Dufresne seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

The next meeting of the Finance Committee will be held on 23 May 2017 at 7:00 p.m. at the Dunphy school. This meeting will also include a public forum on the budget.

There being no further business before the Committee, L. Rowley moved to adjourn the meeting and the motion was seconded by C. Dudek. The motion passed unanimously and the meeting was adjourned at 7:45 p.m.
