Agenda Review

Agenda:

- Debrief of meeting with Selectboard.
 - Board members had concerns about the budget and size of complex.
 - Board members stated concerns about separation of the two safety departments (police and fire) and getting support from voters if the two department projects are separated
 - Committee members felt that there needed to be better communication to the Board of Selectmen because many comments made indicated a lack of knowing all the work the Committee has done and why they were looking at the options they were looking at.
 - More communication of meeting process/decisions to Selectboard is needed
 - Comments from Board members reflected thoughts in the community after reading the newspaper article.
 - Time to communicate updates to general public and to safety department's members
 - Use of media to share updates
