WILLIAMSBURG PUBLIC SAFETY COMPLEX PROJECT

Greetings from the Public Safety Complex Building Committee. We are here to bring you another update on recent progress made and anticipated milestones ahead. Since our previous newsletter, the committee, the Owner's Project Manager, and the design team have successfully put the project out to public bid. In March, the town was in



receipt of multiple competitive bids for both the demolition of the Helen E. James School building, as well as bids for the new construction of the Public Safety Complex. After the review of bids, the Town has awarded the contracts and is now in discussion regarding scheduling for the construction phase. The Demolition will be done by Costello Dismantling of West Wareham, MA, and the new building will be done by Forish Construction of Westfield, MA. Both firms have a long and distinguished portfolio of projects similar to Williamsburg. As the project advances, we will bring more specifics regarding construction sequence and what to expect in the coming months. Looking ahead to May, the site will be fenced off to the public, and the hazmat crews will begin their work inside. Once the building is completely removed, Forish Construction will immediately begin on building foundations.
